# Terms of Reference - Overview

## GOALS

- To create a **forum of exchange** between OGMP 2.0 members for the sharing of ideas, challenges, opportunities, lessons learned
- To help all members **overcome technical and other challenges** experienced in implementing approaches to achieve OGMP 2.0 'gold standard'
- Share learnings and **enable efficient implementation** of OGMP 2.0 requirements across participating members, to ensure broad industry credibility in methane emissions data and reporting

## SCOPE

- **Discussion and exchange** between signatories around OGMP 2.0-related topics, either on a bilateral or group basis
- Does **not replace the Mirror Groups or Task Forces**, which are aimed at multi-stakeholder development of guidance, but **helps clarify** interpretation of e.g. the MOU, reporting framework, and implementation of the associated guidance

## WAYS OF WORKING

- **Monthly informal meetings** on topics raised by participating industry members
- Participation is purely **voluntary**
- No obligation to join discussions/provide information/data
- Follows **legal and compliance rules**
- **Host and preparation of high-level agenda** and collection of topics rotates amongst participating companies

## FOCUS AREAS

- Emerging **technology opportunities and challenges** (development/deployment)
- Interpretation of implementation plan **score card elements** and requirements for annual reports
- **Lessons learned** on implementation approaches (e.g. reducing data uncertainty, finding appropriate sampling/measurement methodology and reconciliation approaches)
- Methods for **working effectively with NOJVs**, defining reasonable endeavors
- Opportunity to develop **multi-client** studies to close knowledge gaps, share learnings, and reduce individual company costs
- IMEO reporting

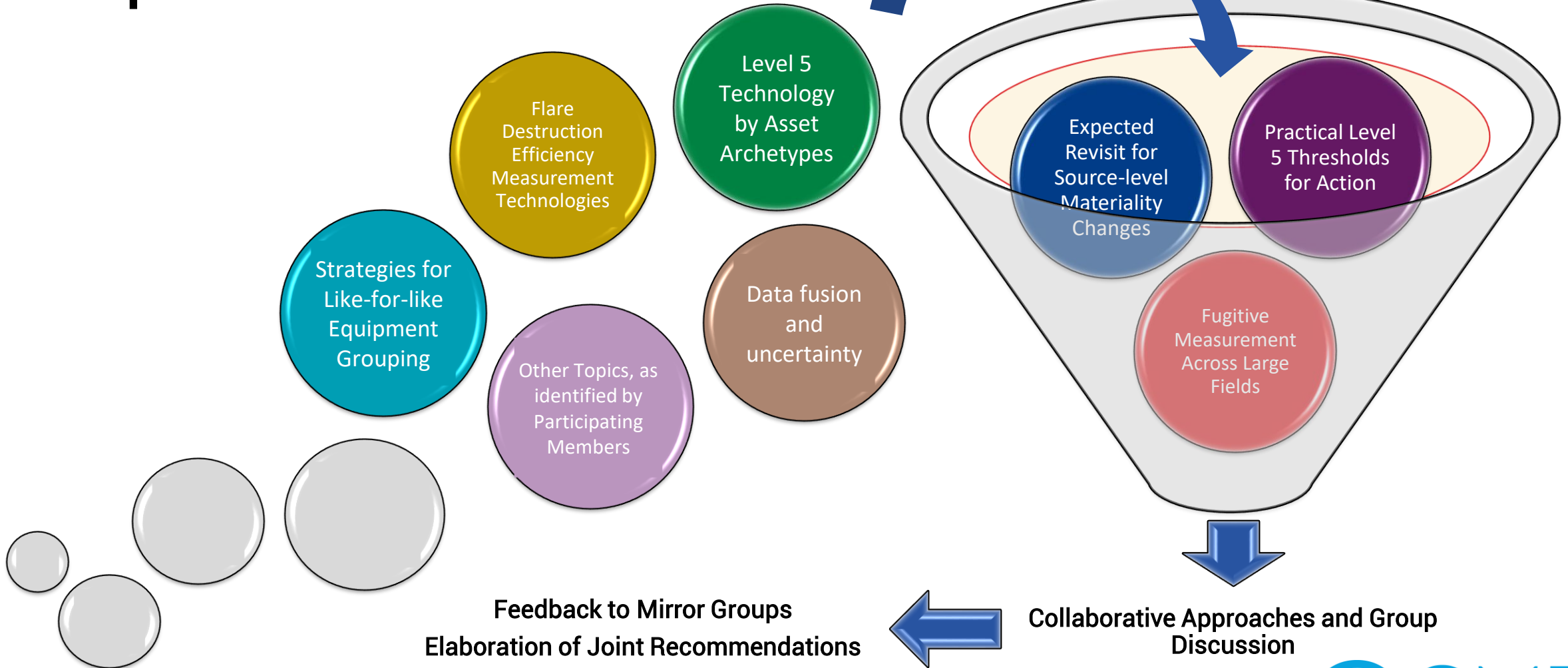
